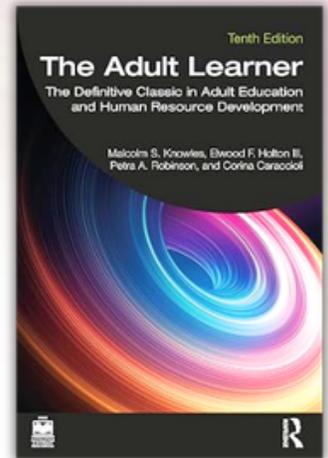
What You'll Gain

In order to receive Ashland Graduate Credit for the above courses, in addition to completing all other assigned activities, you must also complete the following tasks:

- For 1 Graduate Credit Hour: Write a 2-page paper synthesizing activities 2 and 3, detailing how the response you received in activity 2 informed your design in activity 3: 2) Interview 3–5 teachers about PD barriers and summarize themes, and 3) Design a short experiential learning cycle for an upcoming PD topic.
- For 2 Graduate Credit Hours: Write a 2-page paper synthesizing activities 5 and 6, detailing how your teacher self-identified needs assessment informed your choice of new instructional method: 5) Conduct a mini needs-assessment using a small teacher sample, and 6) Create a PD session outline using one new instructional method.
- For 3 Graduate Credit Hours: Write a 2-page paper explaining your rationale for your redesign proposal and how the book informed you choices.
- Please note - Ashland has moved to a new software platform, and everyone will need to create a brand-new profile regardless of whether they have taken courses with Ashland in the past. Once they create the new account, the new system will sync with the old system and merge their profiles together.
