I would like to join the BIS Student Council for the 26-27 school year and I will adhere to the expectations and responsibilities required of all members, as stated below.

Attendance: Students are expected to be present at all meetings. If a student will miss a meeting, please notify a sponsor beforehand. **Also, if a student is picked up more than 10 minutes late, twice, the student will be asked to withdraw from Student Council.

Behavior: Student Council members must remain in good standing according to our school wide Positive Behavior System. If a student receives more than 4 minor infractions in a nine-week period, they will not be able to participate in student council. If any member receives a major referral during the school year, they forfeit their student council membership and will be unable to participate (subject to administration's discretion).

Academic Eligibility: Students must remain in good academic standing by maintaining passing grades in all core subjects (ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies). If a grade in a core subject falls below a C on a report card, they will forfeit their participation in student council the following nine-week period.
