

REGISTRATION AND TUITION FEES: Registration is \$30.00 per semester. This fee is non-refundable. Courses are \$220.00 per semester. Need based Scholarships are available as well as Family Discounts. Please see page 4 for more information.

PACE & RIGOR: Summer School is an accelerated pace design. You are learning in 13 days what would have taken a full semester during the regular school year. The benefit is that you are taking just one course and can focus your attention to the material in that subject. However, being successful in an accelerated pace class requires your commitment to completing assignments and preparing for assessments in a timely manner. Be prepared to devote a significant amount of time both in and out of class. If you find it difficult to work at this pace, you may want to rethink taking a Summer School course. Please consider speaking with your family and your school counselor if you are unsure, and before registering.

ATTENDANCE POLICY: Because Summer School is compressed into an extremely short time frame, attendance is strictly observed. In order to satisfy the requirements to earn credit for the class, students must be present and on time each day. Teachers record attendance for each hour of class. Each tardy is equivalent to one hour unexcused absence. Students who have missed more than 7 hours per semester will be dropped. There are no excused absences in summer school—illness and medical appointments are considered unexcused. Please plan appointments for times outside of class. Students who are not present on the first day of class will be dropped.

NEED-BASED SCHOLARSHIPS: Current Redlands Unified Students who qualify will be offered Scholarships to attend AAA Academy Summer School. To apply, please use the link found on our website at www.aaa-academy.com. Go to the High School Summer School menu and use the link on the page to apply.

FAMILY DISCOUNTS: Students registering from the same family receive discounts on tuition. For the 2nd student from the same family, you will receive a discount of \$50 off the tuition for each semester. For the 3rd student (and beyond), you will receive a discount of \$100 off the tuition for each semester. Discount codes are shown on the website.

<u>CREDIT FOR COURSEWORK</u>: All of our academic courses are taught by credentialed teachers and follow the same scope and sequence as courses offered by Redlands USD during the regular academic year and provide full credit. Each semester class successfully completed with a passing grade will count as 5.0 credits.

REPORT CARDS: Report cards will be mailed to the student's address of record in the Redlands USD database at the close of summer school. Please be sure that you provide us with your correct and current address.

TRANSCRIPTS: Non-Redlands students will need to request a transcript to provide to their school in order to receive credit. Transcript fees can be paid when registering. Please provide the name of the school that you will attend in Fall 2019.

Students dismissed for disciplinary action are not elgible for refund of their tuition.

<u>REFUNDS:</u> If you need to cancel your registration, the following fees apply and will be deducted from any tuition paid to date. Registration Fees are non-refundable.

No Refunds are offered after June 12

*Please note that cancellation fees are deducted from the original payment for tuition and may take up to four weeks to process.

Cancellation Fees are waived if the student must attend Credit Recovery or for Medical Reasons that prevent the student from attending.

*Refunds are issued to the original purchaser only.

COURSE OFFERINGS

AMERICAN GOVERNMENT

OPEN TO: INCOMING 12TH CREDITS: 5.0 LENGTH: 1 SEMESTER TUITION: \$220

Content: This is Part 1 of the senior year history requirement. Students are introduced to the origins and background of American Government. Included in the course content are units of study that include the political process, American governmental institutions, civil rights and responsibilities, and the structure and functioning of state and local government. (Compliment Course: ECONOMICS)

ART (COLLEGE PREP)

OPEN TO: ALL STUDENTS CREDITS: 10.0 LENGTH: 2 SEMESTERS TUITION: \$440

Content: Students will explore art fundamentals that include the elements and principles of design, basic drawing and painting, and additional studio exercises. Students will also explore how art and the arts in their world connect to the past and to other cultures. In addition to curriculum typically offered in Studio Art I and II, Art (CP) will also include an academic component in keeping with the guidelines required by UC and CSU. Students will be responsible for textbook work, homework, note taking, research and written projects. Units of study will include subjective and objective assessments including comprehensive examinations and a cumulative project portfolio requirement.

BIOLOGY

OPEN TO: ALL GRADES CREDITS: 10.0 LENGTH: 2 SEMESTERS TUITION: \$440

Prerequisite: 3.0 academic GPA recommended for grade 9 students

Content: This is a survey course of living organisms and biological processes with correlated laboratory experiments and demonstrations. This class meets UC/CSU A-G pattern classes as a lab science.

CHEMISTRY

OPEN TO: INCOMING 10TH & HIGHER CREDITS: 10.0 LENGTH: 2 SEMESTERS TUITION: \$440

Prerequisite: Recommended Algebra II or higher math course.

Content: A mathematical study of the basic laws and theories of chemical and physical change. The course includes the concept of the mole, bonding theory, chemical energy, gas laws, acid-base theory, oxidation-reduction, modern atomic theory, and study of simple organic molecules. Laboratory work will be correlated to course content and students will learn basic laboratory skills and techniques needed to do experimentation. Recommended for college-bound students.

ECONOMICS

OPEN TO: INCOMING 12[™] CREDITS: 5.0 LENGTH: 1 SEMESTER TUITION: \$220

Content: This is Part 2 of the senior year of history requirement. Students are introduced to the need for effective decision making. Microeconomic and macro-economic units are studied. Students will use tools of analysis to understand economic concepts and relationships. Throughout the course, contemporary and global economic issues are incorporated into the curriculum. (Compliment Course: AMERICAN GOVERNMENT)

PHYSICAL EDUCATION (CO-ED)

OPEN TO: INCOMING 10[™] & HIGHER CREDITS: 5.0 OR 10.0 LENGTH: 1 OR 2 SEMESTERS

TUITION: \$220-\$440

Content: Students participate in a variety of activities which may include: flag football, soccer, swimming, hustle ball, and volleyball. All classes will include health related fitness instruction, practice and testing for improvement.

Please be prepared the first day of summer school by wearing and/or bringing the following items: shorts, t-shirts, athletic shoes and socks, swim suit, towel. You may also wear a hat and sunglasses while participating in outside sports only. Sunscreen and extra water is recommended. A swim suit and towel will be needed daily. Please note that cell phones and other tech items such as iPods are not recommended due to not having an assigned locker. You may provide your own lock to protect valuables in your locker. Locks must be removed at the end of each day.

PHYSICAL GEOGRAPHY

OPEN TO: ALL STUDENTS CREDITS: 5.0 LENGTH: 1 SEMESTER TUITION: \$220

Content: In this one-semester course students will investigate land and water forms, locations and map interpretation, geopolitical issues, graphs, weather, climate and ecosystems. The course will also delve into the interrelationships between physical geography and the cultural effects of geography on mankind. The course will involve students in creating projects and making presentations. Specific contributions by different cultures will be emphasized. This class is for ELECTIVE credit and DOES NOT meet the World History & Geography requirement for graduation.

SPANISH I

OPEN TO: ALL STUDENTS CREDITS: 10.0 LENGTH: 2 SEMESTERS TUITION: \$440

Content: Students will be exposed to the four basic elements of foreign language study: listening, speaking, reading and writing. Oral participation and grammatical structure are stressed. Learning the culture of Spanish speaking peoples is part of the course.

UNITED STATES HISTORY

OPEN TO: INCOMING 11[™] & HIGHER CREDITS: 10.0 LENGTH: 2 SEMESTERS TUITION: \$440

Content: This course is a survey of U.S. History from Colonial period to the present with emphasis on the Twentieth Century. Throughout the course, teachers use methods which enhance critical thinking and geography skills and emphasize a multi-cultural approach to the study of U.S. History. Requirements first semester include a U.S. map test which students must pass with a 70% grade.

WORLD HISTORY

OPEN TO: INCOMING 10TH & HIGHER CREDITS: 10.0 LENGTH: 2 SEMESTERS TUITION \$440

Content: This course will provide a study of man's development from the Age of Enlightenment to the contemporary world with emphasis on the causes and consequences of World Wars I and II. Included will be area studies of the former U.S.S.R., Eastern Europe, China, Africa, Middle East, and Latin America.



A-G REQUIREMENTS

The A-G / College Entrance Requirements are a sequence of high school courses that students **must complete** (with a grade of C or better) to be <u>minimally eligible</u> for admission to the University of California (UC) and California State University (CSU). They represent the basic level of academic preparation that high school students should achieve to undertake university work.

*American Government and Economics, once successfully completed, will fulfill one year of category A.
